Capt. Bengtson received the Chief of Naval Operations Legion of Merit, a gold star in lieu of second award, presented by Rear Adm. McPherson, who was assisted by Bengtson's daughter, Britta.

Capt. Greene comes to Newport from his last duty station, as commanding officer of the Naval Legal Service Office Central, Pensacola, Fla.

Capt. Greene graduated from the University of North Carolina, and received his juris doctorate from Wake Forest University, School of Law.

After entering active duty in 1976, his assignments have included Naval Legal Service Office, Jacksonville, Fla., the U.S. Naval Security Group Activity, Misawa, Japan; the carrier USS Forrestal; the Office of Judge Advocate General (Military Justice Division and Investigation Division); Commander, Carrier Group

THREE; Naval Special Warfare Development Group, Virginia Beach, Va., Commander, U.S. Naval Forces, Japan; and Chief of Naval Education and Training in Pensacola.

Capt. Greene is authorized to wear the Legion of Merit with gold star, the Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal with gold star; Navy Commendation Medal with two gold stars; and Navy Achievement Medal.

Capt. Greene is married to the former Nance Robinson of Jacksonville, and they have four children. Capt. Bengtson will report to Defense Institute for International Legal Studies.

# 1,000 expected for reenactment of Battle of R.I.

PORTSMOUTH — An estimated 1,000 re-enactors in 18th century costume will participate in the 225th anniversary reenactment of the Battle of Rhode Island this weekend at Glen Park and Farm off East Main Road.

The free reenactment is sponsored by the Brigade of the American Revolution, and participants will come from across New England and as far as Florida and California.

Large colonial militia and British/Hessian encampments will be established in Glen Park off Glen Road, and will be open to the public Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

There will be information

booths and refreshment trailers. Signs will direct visitors to the battlefields, and a hayride "shuttle" will be available for a nominal fee.

For the entire month of August 1778, units of the fledgling Continental Army laid siege to 7,000 British, Hessian and Provincial troops occupying Newport.

About 10,000 continental and state troops, Massachusetts, Connecticut and New Hampshire militia, dragoons, light artillery and French officers were entrenched on Aquidneck Island, then known as "Rhode Island and Providence Plantations."

But hearing of British reinforcements on the way from New York, the colonists and French allies decided to aban-

Eight hundred dollars worth of prizes were awarded for second and third place in each category.

The tournament ended with a cookout near the Naval Station Newport Marina.

Buco Brothers, Sam's Bait and Tackle, Life Raft and Survival Equipment Company, Edwards Fishing Tackle and Newport Nautical helped sponsor the event. CHNYC's Commodore, Jim Gilmore, hopes to make the tournament an annual event.



## Commissary conducts its first online survey

FORT LEE, Va. — A commissary industry committee is spearheading a first-ever online survey aimed at finding out more about the commissary shopping habits and perception of savings of active duty military service members.

The survey is being funded, conducted, and compiled by the Consumer Awareness Team, a commissary industry committee that researches and funds projects to help military service members understand the value of their commissary benefit.

At stake for anyone taking the survey: two minutes of their time and a chance to win one of 250 commissary gift certificates valued at \$50 each. The certificates are also funded by industry.

Since the survey is being conducted and funded by private industry, the survey is not available at commissaries, but can be taken online at <http://catsurvey.shortsurveys.com>. The online survey will be available through September.

Any authorized Commissary shopper is welcome to take the

survey, but the Consumer Awareness Team does have a specific audience it's trying to reach. "We want to gather more information on the shopping habits of active service members, particularly E1-E6 and junior officers," said Steve Lamkin, CAT chairman.

"The results will help us make decisions about what outreach projects we undertake. In addition, our projects are funded by the manufacturers who sell products to commissary customers, so those manufacturers obviously have an interest in any projects that will increase business."

The survey has just six questions on demographic information such as duty and family status, frequency of shopping, perception of commissary savings and percent of household grocery money spent at the commissary.

According to Deborah Kalas, chairman of the CAT survey sub-committee, "Even though shoppers can save 30 percent or more over retail at the commissary, it's sometimes difficult to get the word out to new military members that the commissary can really help them."


The Black Sheep had to beat The Chiefs twice for the championship, and it was no cakewalk. The first game was tight, but the second was tighter.



"The benefits of sponsorship go beyond the short-term benefit of providing the candidates with a stress free environment. NAPS traditionally loses one fourth of each class to disenrollments," he said. "We feel that positive sponsor families enable the students to better cope with the rigorous environment and give them an opportunity to become officers in their respective services.

"Our goal this academic year is to provide sponsors for all of the 327 candidates who desire one."

Standard liberty periods for the midshipman candidates are Saturday from 10 a.m. to about midnight, and Sunday, from 7:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Additionally, there are holiday periods such as Thanksgiving, Christmas, and spring break when some students are unable to make it home and would benefit from having a mentor/sponsor to spend time with. don their front lines and retreat to Portsmouth for a last stand.

The reenactment Saturday at 1 p.m. will recreate the battle at Turkey Hill on Route 114, where a column of Hessian and Provincial troops met American light infantry and Continentals. The battle will be held at Glen Park.

Sunday's reenactment at 1 p.m. will recreate British General Smith column's advance up Route 138 toward Quaker Hill, where it was ambushed by continentals and militia at Glen Farm. The battle will begin in the fields west of Glen Park, and move toward the historic Brown House at Glen Farm to the south.

Historians will narrate both battles.

Saturday and Sunday mornings will feature a cricket match between American and British crown troops in a horse ring, followed by narrated American music, artillery and cavalry demonstrations at Battlefield Ridge.

The Battle of Rhode Island was the only battle in New England in which Continental Army units fought columns of British "redcoats" and Hessian allies.

The brigade is a non-profit living history association dedicated to recreating the life and times of the common soldier of the American War for Independence, 1775-1783. Members represent elements of all the armies then involved: Continental, militiamen, British, loyalist, German, French, Spanish and Native Americans.





### Sailors pushing for sheepskins

BETHESDA, Md. (NNS) — The National Naval Medical Center's Navy College Office might consider installing revolving doors to accommodate the constant flow of students who are dashing in and getting information to help them prepare for the upcoming school year.

Whether you are a newcomer to the office, or a familiar face, Bethesda Navy College Director, Kenneth Rumph says the first step to getting ready to go back to school is having a counseling session with an adviser.

"It's important to first divulge where a student's interests lie so we can build up from there," said Rumph. "We get all kinds of students who are in different phases of their education, some haven't taken one class yet. To be able to serve them properly, advisors have to initially sit down with them, get acquainted, and see

what direction they are headed in. They might not know what subjects they want to pursue and we help provide that guidance."

After that, Rumph said it's down to business.

"If they have an idea of what program they want to get involved in, and what schools

they want to attend, it is relatively easy to get the ball rolling," said Rumph. "Then they can apply for admissions, schedule classes, and begin working on their Tuition Assistance (TA) request through our office."

TA, the Navy's educational financial assistance program,

provides active duty personnel funding for tuition costs for courses taken in an off-duty status at accredited colleges, universities or vocational/technical institutions. The program pays 100 percent tuition and required fees charged by educational institutions for course enroll-

ments, with caps, stipulations and limits.

Payment for tuition and fees does not exceed the following caps:

- \$250 per semester hour
- \$166.67 per quarter hour
- \$16.67 per clock hour
- \$166.67 per Continuing Education Unit (CEU).
